

This supplement chapter is a follow up and should be read in conjunction with the 'SE 90/40' section in the '*Germany up to 1945*' chapter, and the 'Stazione RN-6' section in the '*Italy*' chapter of WftW Volume 4 for more information.

REMARKS

The S 90/40 was a shortwave transmitter normally associated with a separate E90 (E75) receiver and power unit GISE, forming station SE 90/40, which was usually packed in a suitcase. The standard version covered 3.5-8.5MHz, noted are other fre-

quency ranges e.g. 5.3-9.3MHz. The transmitter shown in the photo above (serial number 2) had Italian markings which led to the belief that a small number of S 90/40 transmitters were acquired by the Italian equivalent of the Abwehr. This most likely resulted in the RN-6, an Italian version of the S 90-40, produced by Nova Radio in Milan.


