



KR-022/KT-023 Country of origin: USA

**DATA SUMMARY**

**Organisation:** Unknown  
**Design/Manufacturer:** Unknown.  
**Year of Introduction:** Early 1950s.  
**Purpose:** Agents.  
**Receiver:** Superhet with tunable BFO. AM and CW.  
**Frequency:** 3-8MHz and 7-15MHz.  
**Transmitter:** Crystal control or VFO. CW only.  
**Frequency:** 4-9MHz and 8-15MHz.  
**Accessories:** Miniature Morse key, earphone, external meter for transmitter, power supply unit and metal transport case.

**REMARKS**

The KT-023 transmitter and KR-022 receiver were part of an agents radio set, which was packed in a metal container/carrying case along with its mains power supply unit and accessories. Details of the country of origin and deployment are not yet known. Although the external meter for the transmitter was made in the USA, it may be speculated that the set was not produced in the United States but in an European country. It is interesting to see that it had elements of the HR/HT-0008 agents set depicted in Chapter 42 of WftW Supplements. The not yet identified miniature Morse key was, considering its construction and finish, not a product made in large quantities. The set is currently on display in the US Army Intelligence Museum located in Fort Huachuca, Arizona, and brought to attention by Dave Bushong, KZ1O, USA.
