Organisation: Polish Home Army (Armia Krajowa); SOE **Design/Manufacturer:** Polish Military Wireless Reseach Unit, Stanmore, England (Polski Wojskowy Warsztat Radiowy).

Year of Introduction: Probably 1944. Purpose: Partisans.

Receiver:

Circuit Features: Mix/Osc, Reg IF, Det/AF, AF (AM R/T and CW) Frequency Coverage: Medium wave, 2-12MHz. Intermediate Frequency: Unknown. Valves: 1R5, 1T4 (2x), 1S5.

Power Supply: 60V HT, 1.5V LT. **Size (cm):** Height 8, Length 17.5, Width 12.5. **Accessories:** Wire for aerial and earth, headphones.

REMARKS

The OP3-G was a miniature receiver intended for use by resistance organisations. It was manufactured in England by the Polish Wireless Research Unit in Stanmore.

The receiver unit of the OP3-G was similar to the OP3. The whole set differed only in a miniature loudspeaker which was incorporated in the battery box, and a combined battery box/receiver case.
