REMARKS

The Labe (Slovak name of the river Elbe) is a bit of a mystery receiver. Unlike the Labe A (see Chapter 20) it was used by Department 1 espionage considering the project number TI 575 P. The frequency range switch has, apart from two short wave ranges, three other positions which might indicate wide band and close proximity interception, the latter assumed because of the presence of a -40dB attenuator switch.
