Report were the results of the first investigations at S.E.E. on the possible application of frequency modulation to British military radio communication. This unique document gives evidence that frequency modulation for British Army communication was very seriously investigated from 1941 onwards. An original is held in the archive of the Royal Signals Museum, Blandford Camp, Blandford Forum, UK.
